### (Chap. 2)

#### Vv1-4

Habakkuk has now taken his case before the Lord. Now he sits and waits for God to respond. V1

1. **Define reprove. What does this suggest as to how Habakkuk thinks God will take to his inquiry?**
2. **What instructions does he give Habakkuk regarding what he is about to tell him?**
3. **How does God describe the vision that he is about to give to Habakkuk?**
4. **What 2 “classes” of people are described here? Who does each one represent?**

The rest of the chap. Will deal with the judgment that is to come upon Babylon, (the unrighteous), in a series of “Woes” (or bewares).

1. **In what 2 ways does God describe Babylon? V5**

#### First woe, vv6-8

1. **Explain this first Woe. What has Babylon done, and how will they be dealt with?**

#### Second woe, vv9-11

1. **What has Babylon done here?**
2. **What are they thinking as they “build their nest on high”? v9**
3. **How do they look in the eyes of their own people?**
4. **Will they be able to keep this wickedness quiet? V11**

**Third woe, vv12-14**

1. What is being remembered here?
2. What has God determined about all the building that Babylon is doing?
3. Why will it be for nothing? V14

Do you think Habakkuk is beginning to feel a little better???

**Fourth woe, vv15-18**

1. What is their wickedness compared to here?
2. What is going to happen to them? Vv16,17
3. Will their idols be able to save them? Vv18,19 Why not?

**Fifth woe, vv19,20**

1. What is the contrast between idols and the God of Heaven?
2. Who is Babylon trusting in?
3. Who is Habakkuk and Judah trusting in?
